#### IAC Youth Contest


High school students throughout Indian County are invited to participate in Intertribal Agriculture Council's "Agriculture: Investing in Sovereignty" essay contest.


#### North Central Fall Weather Outlook

As a mission to protect public health and the environment, the EPA is offering a grant for tribal communities to develop pesticide programs. Proposals are due November 20th.


#### DOE Announces Tribal Energy Funding
