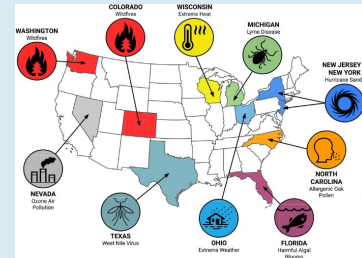

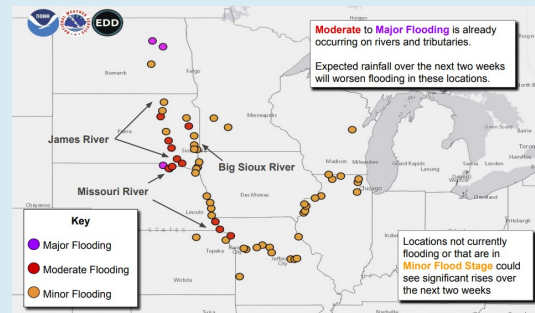
High school students throughout Indian County are invited to participate in Intertribal Agriculture Council's "Agriculture: Investing in Sovereignty" essay contest.

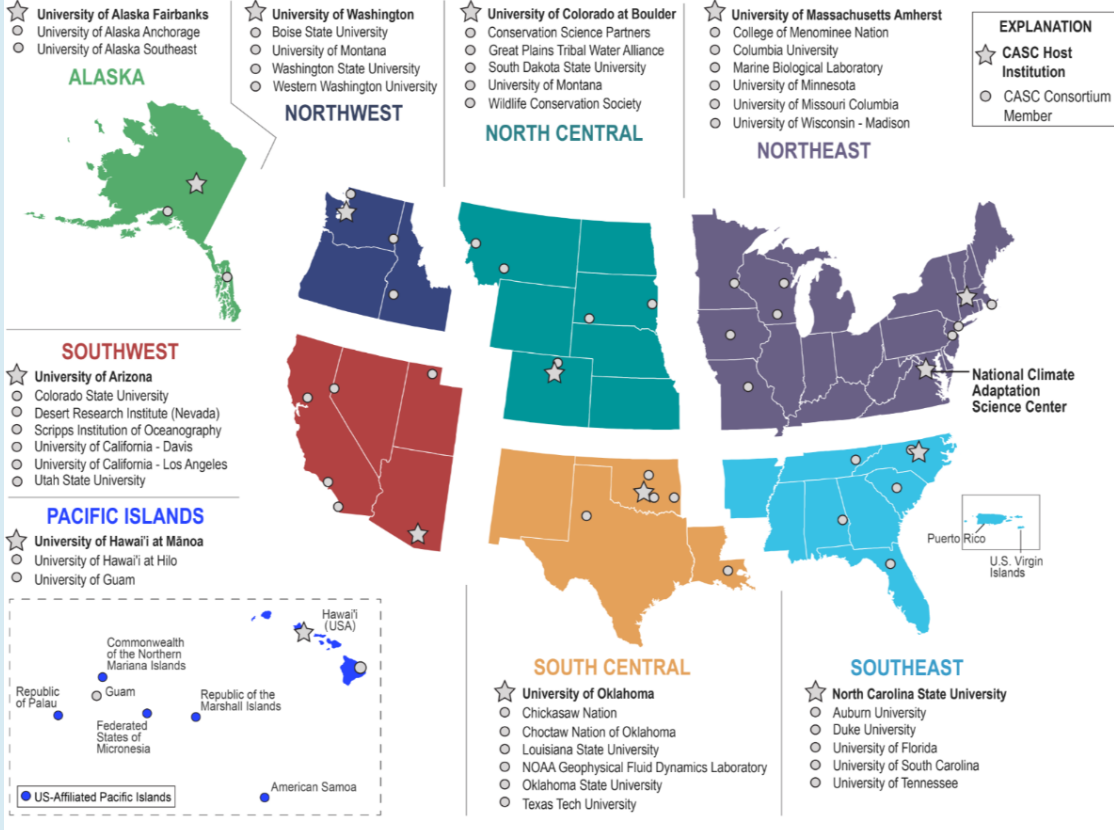
